CARRA's culture of collaboration focuses on facilitating, accelerating, funding, and performing research driven by academicians, clinicians, patients, and families to fulfill its mission: to conduct collaborative research to prevent, treat, and cure pediatric rheumatic diseases. CARRA's peer-reviewed Intramural Grant Program offers various funding opportunities to support investigators at all career levels and advance research that furthers our mission.

Program Description

This opportunity is available to support research projects prioritized by a CARRA Committee that further the CARRA mission under the <u>2023-2025 Strategic Plan</u> and <u>2023-2025 Research Agenda</u>, including projects focused on revising and updating Consensus Treatment Plans (CTPs).

This grant program does not allow for CARRA Registry and Biosample use and collection. For any questions you may have, please contact the CARRA grants manager at grants@carragroup.org.

Up to 3 grants will be awarded. At least one of the awards must focus on juvenile arthritis and areas identified in the 2023-2025 CARRA-Arthritis Foundation Inflammatory Arthritis Research Agenda as outlined below.

- Precision Medicine
 - Biomarker identification; diagnostic and prognostic
 - Starting/stopping medication
 - Safety and the impact of use of specific medications (e.g., TNFi in non-systemic JIA)
- Patient Outcomes and Outcome Measures
 - Patient reported outcomes (PROs); impact on health-related quality of life, health disparities and other related issues
 - Long-term outcomes; impact on childbearing, occupation, college, marriage, delays vs. peers, growth, and reproductive health
 - Transition
 - Health-related quality of life (HRQOL)
 - Environmental factors
 - Tools/outcome measure development, implementation, and ongoing validation
- Representativeness
 - Social determinants of health
- Treatment Development
 - Working with the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) on acceptable trial designs in pediatric patients

- Evidence development
- Comparative Effectiveness Research
- CTP Programs (development, revision, and implementation)

Preference will be given to research that is collaborative in nature.

New or early-career investigators are encouraged to apply.

Eligibility

- The project PI for all grants must be a current CARRA member who is up to date on membership dues and has ensured their membership information (location, contact information, and membership status) is current and accurate.
- The following current CARRA members are eligible to serve as Principal Investigators on CARRA-Arthritis Foundation Large Grants:
 - Pediatric Rheumatologists
 - Other Physicians and Health Care Professionals*
 - Research professionals (research scientists, investigators, and coordinators) *
 - Fellows*
 - Residents*
 - Patient/Caregiver Associate Members*
 - *Must have a Pediatric Rheumatologist as a Co-I on the grant
- Not eligible: Medical and graduate students, Research professional members who are regulatory or data coordinators, Business and Industry Associate members, Nonprofit/Government Associate members, members of CARRA's Board of Directors. Emeritus members are not permitted to serve as PIs but can serve as key personnel.
